

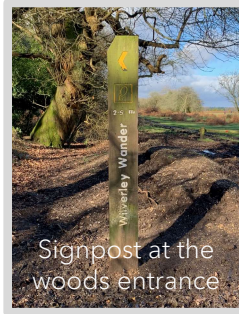
Wilverley Inclosure - New Forest

Total ascent 50 metres



Set in the heart of the New Forest between Burley and Brockenhurst this walk provides a straightforward route, on good tracks, through an enclosed woodland. There are views across moorland from the car park, but the route soon heads deep inside the beautiful woods with a variety of trees, vegetation and wildlife.



OS Maps App

- 1 Start from either the Wilverley Plain or Wilverley Inclosure car park and – with the enclosed woods to your left – walk anti-clockwise through the car parks until you see the Wilverley Wander signpost.
- 2 Enter the woods through the gate at the signpost and follow the wide flat track ahead. Ignore all smaller paths to the left and right.
- 3 At the track T junction turn right.
- 4 Stay on the track to head downhill and then uphill. This section is steep so take extra care with wheelchairs and pushchairs.
- 5 After the track levels off turn sharp left onto another good track. If you come to the road then you've missed the turning.
- 6 At the path crossroads stay on the main track.
- 7 Bear right to stay on the main track.
- 8 Bear left to stay on the main track and head uphill (do not head towards the road).
- 9 When you meet another good track turn right towards the gate. Pass through this gate to the carpark.

- The route is entirely on flat stoney track. Some small puddles after rain but the surface is generally good – even in winter. A few short steep sections max 1:9.5 (10.5%). Other paths shown on the map may have muddy and uneven surfaces and may not be suitable shortcuts.
- No stiles or steps on the route. Gates only on the entrance and exit to the woods - both wider than one metre
- Seats with backrests (12). Maximum distance between seats is 800 metres (uphill between points 8 and 9).
- Parking available, no electric charge points. The nearest bus stop is near the Old Station Tea Rooms, Holmsley.
- Male and female and accessible toilets in the carpark.
- No food, drink or shops on the route. Tea room nearby – the Old Station Tea Rooms, Holmsley. Otherwise in Burley and Brockenhurst.
- The entrance to the woods is signposted. Paths are obvious tracks. Follow the yellow topped marker posts. Information board in car park.
- Wheelchair accessible for some, depending on the ability of the chair to handle steep sections. Pushchair accessible.
